## EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

**A**s our program welcomes in the New Year of 2019, I and the classroom teachers want to express our appreciation for the *many* generous offerings from the congregation of our church – generous monetary donations; participation in our Scholastic Book Fairs; donations of out-grown toys, crafting items, and books, etc. **Thank you very much** for thinking about our ministry and the wonderful ways we contribute to our church and to our community!



We have a current need to find/hire *additional classroom co-teaching* staff to work in our program!

We employ persons that we feel have the appropriate gifts and talents to share with children and that we can also help to achieve the highest level of service for the Lord within this ministry of our church and to our community!

We will accept **employment applications** for adults (*18 years of age and older*) that would like to be a part of our staff at ECECC in these areas:

- **Parent Day Out Classes** (*Mondays and Wednesdays working 9:15am to 3:15pm*);
- **Co-teaching position in our 2-Year old classroom**—This shall be a person with a high school diploma, a general understanding and love for, and possible previous experience caring for young children. Work days are Mondays and Wednesdays (9:15am to 3:15pm and follow the public school calendar); **and**

- **Periodic Substitutes** to fill in when a classroom teacher needs to be absent. This will be a “floating” position and, often as has occurred in the past, this position may lead to a permanent classroom teaching position.

*Adult applicants with young children are definitely considered for all positions, but at this time we have **very limited** openings for their child’s placement.*

All applicants that are offered a position will:

- Go through a multi-step interview process so that we can find the “right” person;
- Be required to submit to fingerprinting, background and reference checks;
- Be able and willing to be CPR/First Aid certified, and, be able to lift up to 30 pounds;
- Participate in a multi-level orientation process that is required.
